

## Part Eight Relief Supplies for Refugees

In Thailand, we continue to give tins of fish and other supplies such as: rice, clothes, and medicines to orphanages and hostels in many Karen refugee camps on the Thai/Burmese border. Many of the refugees have been in these camps for many years. When we first visited the camps, we noticed that most of the children are stunted in their growth. The United Nations provide rice and oil, but the children lack protein. Our generosity of our donors, through the Chrestos Relief Teams, are able to supply tins of mackerel to some of these camps.

They had been travelling for about two weeks, after their village had been attacked and destroyed. We were so pleased to be able to help them with blankets, clothes and tins of fish. Our time there finished with a service of worship and thanks-giving to God in their bamboo church that was filled to overflowing.
